# Is This a Foul?

Why or Why Not? What's the Restart?

- A player spits at his teammate.
- The referee blows the whistle for offside, and a defender then trips the running attacker in a reckless manner.
- As an attacker runs by, a defender grabs and holds his arm.
- As the ball goes out for a goal kick, two opponents run beyond the goal line. The attacker then kicks the defender with excessive force.

# Laws 13-17

- When is a corner kick awarded?
- Where is a corner kick taken from?
- Where must the opponents be?
- When is a corner kick in play?
- What if corner kick goes in opponent's goal?
- Can the kicker move the corner flag?

# Restarts

- An attacker kicks the ball over the goal line, not in the goal?
- A defender kicks the ball over the goal line, not in the goal?
- An attacker handles the ball in the penalty area?
- A defender other than the goalkeeper handles the ball in the penalty area?
- A defender kicks a direct free kick from near midfield into his own goal?

# Restarts

- At the kickoff, the attacker kicks the ball, it bounces off the referee, and the same attacker kicks it again. Is this an infraction?
- A dog stops a shot on goal right on the goal line?
- A player throws the ball directly into his own goal?
- An attacker is judged to be in an offside position when the ball is played by his teammate, and he interferes with play?
- An attacker kicks a corner kick directly into his opponent's goal?
